HOST CITY

Wagga Wagga is nestled on the banks of the Murrumbidgee River and is the largest regional city in NSW. In 1965 Council adopted a city flag, at the time it negotiated a “Coat of Arms” through the College of Arms in London. The flag was designed by Mr H Ellis Tomlinson, MA, FHS.

The stalks of wheat and other motifs incorporated in the design were suggested by Council. The design of the city flag was taken from the central motif of the shield of the Coat of Arms, with the design being made square.

The name “Wagga” is derived from the local Wiradjuri Aboriginal language. It is widely accepted that “Wagga” means “crow” and to create the plural, the Wiradjuri people repeat the word. Therefore, Wagga Wagga translates as ‘the place of many crows’.

The Chiko Roll made its first appearance at the Wagga Wagga Show in 1951. It was inspired by the Chinese spring roll and was designed to be eaten with one hand whilst drinking a beer with the other.

Wagga Wagga is also home to Australia’s premier Livestock Marketing Centre (LMC) for the marketing of both cattle and sheep and lambs!


