

HOST CITY

Tamworth, the 'Country Music Capital of Australia', is located on the Peel River and is the most populated inland city in NSW. Tamworth serves parts of the New England and Western Slopes districts that produce livestock, poultry, wheat, sorghum, and sunflowers. Its industries include meat processing and flour milling.

In 1818, John Oxley passed through and thirteen years later, the first sheep and cattle stations were established near Goonoo Goonoo. The Kamilaroi people inhabited the area before European contact.



Tamworth is a key agricultural region in NSW, with an estimated 760,000 acres of land used in beef, sheep, grain, dairy, poultry and lucerne production. Tamworth is home to one of Australia's major Regional Livestock Exchanges and livestock processing facilities including Thomas Foods International, TEYS and Baiada.

GETTING THERE

→ Drive

Tamworth is about three-and-half hours north-west of Newcastle along the Hunter Expressway and New England Highway or about five hours from Sydney via the Pacific Motorway, Hunter Expressway and New England Highways.

→ Fly

Tamworth Regional Airport is the largest regional airport in Australia. Flights are operated between Tamworth, Sydney and Brisbane by both Qantas and Link Airways daily. Located just 10 minutes from the Tamworth CBD hire cars are available to hire (Hertz, Budget, Avis), taxis will be available outside the terminal upon arrival, or you can order an UBER.

→ Public Transport

Daily train and coach services operate between Tamworth and several cities including (but not limited to) Sydney, Brisbane, Newcastle, Port Macquarie, Grafton, Armidale, Tenterfield, Inverell, Scone, Muswellbrook, Singleton, Quirindi, Gunnedah, Moree, Narrabri, Dubbo, Orange, and Bathurst.

VENUES

→ Main Venue

The LBRCA Annual Conference in 2023 will be held at the Tamworth Regional Exhibition and Conference Centre (TRECC). The biggest of its kind outside of NSW metropolitan areas, TRECC has a capacity of 5,100 and an exhibition space of approximately 4800 square metres allowing the display of heavy vehicles and large exhibits as well as all conference sessions to happen under one roof.

2023 will see TRECC transformed into a truckie's paradise. Trucks, trailers, and trade exhibits will wrap around the main conference stage and plenary area, providing an unrestricted 360-degree view of the entire event.

TRECC is located 5km south of the Tamworth town centre on Greg Norman Drive. There is ample free public parking on-site (located directly opposite entrance).

→ Saturday Night Gala Dinner Venue

The West Tamworth Leagues Club Function room will host our Blue and White Tie Gala dinner. Guests will enjoy a 3-course meal along with spectacular entertainment from Olympic Gold Medallist **Steven Bradbury** and international comedian and juggling sensation, **James Bustar**, before finishing off the night with our spectacular industry auction.

The West Tamworth Leagues Club Function room is located at Scully Park, Kent Street West Tamworth.

In accepting his prize, Bradbury was triumphant when he said "I'll accept this gold medal. But not for the 90 seconds of this race – I'm going to take it for the 14 years of hard work".
